TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ACCOMMODATIONS: First class hotels based on twin occupancy with bath. Hotel category determined through documentation published by O.H.R.G. Single-room supplement \$80/\$108 per night.
MEALS: American Buffet and (in Israel the famous Israeli breakfast buffet), breakfast, and dinner daily throughout the tour. *Except that no meals are provided in USA.* Extra charge for coffee, tea or other beverage not included in the menu of the day. If a passenger chooses not to have a meal, there will be no refund for unused meals.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included, as are all governmental and local taxes on hotels and meals.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motor coach including services of English speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary.

NOT INCLUDED: Passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, mineral waters and after-dinner coffee or tea, meals not included in the itinerary, room service, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned.

TRAVEL INSURANCE (optional), Maranatha Tours Inc. will automatically bill all passengers for travel insurance unless it is declined at the time of reservation or in writing by the participant.

PASSPORTS, VISAS: A valid US passport is required for US citizens. If you do not have a passport please contact your local passport office. Passports must be valid 6 months after return date. For all other nationalities please consult the country's consulate.

TOUR PRICE: Price is based on international tariffs and rates in effect on Date of proposal and is subject to change without notice should there be a revision in AIR or LAND rates prior to departure of tour. Price is based on a minimum of passengers using double occupancy. In the event that a minimum of passengers does not book the tour within 45 days of departure the agent reserves the right to cancel or re-cost the tour. Late booking or changes may result in an additional fee. Maranatha Tours, Inc. reserves the right to correct invoices, itineraries, and/or brochures without notice.

LAND ONLY: From time to time a tour may be canceled due to not materializing. If you choose to purchase a land only package and arrange your own domestic and international flight independently, Maranatha Tours Inc. will not be responsible for domestic, international flights or transfers of any kind. Maranatha Tours is not responsible for any international flight schedule changes.

If domestic tickets are purchased by an individual, all penalties and fare differences will be paid by the client.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$300 per person is required to secure reservations, which will be applied to the price of the tour. The balance to be paid in full not later than 6 weeks prior to departure of the tour. Thereafter, a \$100 late payment fee will be assessed. Reservations made within 30 days of departure are subject to \$75 late reservation charge. All cancellations must be in writing by letter, fax or e-mail to Maranatha Tours and will be in effect on the date of receipt by Maranatha Tours. There is no exception to cancellation fee. Any exceptions must be in writing from Maranatha Tours, Inc. Air penalties are not part of the percentages below and vary based on the airline policy at the time of ticket issue.

- 91+ Days Prior: No penalty of deposit
- (Except for \$100.00 per person administration fee plus any airline fees)
- 90-61 Days Prior: \$300 for international tour, \$500 for international tour and cruise plus any airline fees
- 60-46 Days Prior: 40% of tour cost

AIR TRANSPORTATION: A round-trip economy class jet, via International air carrier or any other IATA member. Full payment is due 45 days prior to commencement of travel. If the passenger cancels within 35 days of departure or after air tickets are written (whichever comes sooner), then 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger. In the event 35 passengers do not book the tour within 90 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice. **AIR**—Because the travel dates are more than 6 months away, the costs and schedules could change. **Please Note:** A New York overnight may be necessary for any groups traveling from the West Coast, either on the outbound or return.

ITINERARY CHANGES: If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$90 per night; single rooms- \$130 per night. Meals for extra nights are not included.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Maranatha Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others which provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss or damage or non-performance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. International air carriers and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage. The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary, delete or substitute sites when tour operator feels it to be in the best interest of the tour.

CHANGE FEE: All changes not received in writing by Maranatha Tours at least 45 days prior to departure will incur a \$75 change fee per person for each revision (that is in addition to any other charges per revision once the basic or pre/post tour package has been confirmed).

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary due to emergencies.
DEVIATIONS: Deviations will incur a \$125 fee, plus any other additional costs associated with services included in the basic or pre/post tour. Transfers are included in our group round-trip programs, passengers who deviate or purchase land only packages will be responsible for arriving and leaving independently and must transfer at their own expense. **CREDIT CARDS:** All credit card transactions processed by Maranatha Tours directly are subject to a 5% processing fee (excluding the original \$300 deposit).

EXCHANGE RATE FLUCTUATIONS: Foreign currency exchange rates fluctuate daily. For example, in 2008, Euro rates versus the US Dollar fluctuated from a low below 1.25 to almost 1.70 (meaning that one Euro cost \$1.25 to \$1.70 US). It is very difficult to set the price of a tour when we cannot predict what exchange rates will do. We price our tours at a set exchange rate and adjust for fluctuations at final billing. If the rate drops below the original rate, we pass the savings on to our passengers. If rates increase, then we must pass those costs on.



TURKISH AIRLINES

DAY 1 - Tuesday, November 15, 2011

PORTLAND / TEL AVIV

Today we will meet at Portland International airport for our connecting flights to Tel Aviv via wide-body aircraft arriving the next day. Meals served on board.

DAY 2 - Wednesday, November 16, 2011

TEL AVIV / JAFFA / NETANYA

Upon arrival in Tel Aviv we are met by our guide who will be with us for the time we are in the Holy Land. Board our bus and travel through Tel Aviv, the largest city in Israel. Our stop will be at Jaffa (Joppa), the city of Jonah, where Peter had his housetop experience at the home of Simon the Tanner. We proceed to the city of Netanya, on the Mediterranean to our hotel where we will check in overnight.

DAY 3 - Thursday, November 17, 2011

NETANYA / CAESAREA / MEGIDDO / TIBERIAS

This morning we proceed to Caesarea, capital of the Roman procurators of Judea. Visit the Roman port, Crusader's Moat, Roman theater and aqueduct. Continue to Muhraka on Mount Carmel where Elijah challenged Baal's priests.

This afternoon, after a Middle Eastern lunch at a Druse restaurant, we proceed to Megiddo to visit the excavations that unearthed 20 different civilizations. This is Michener's "The Source". Then, it's on to Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight at our hotel. On the way, if there is time we will stop at Harod, the spring of Gideon.

DAY 4 - Friday, November 18, 2011

TIBERIAS / GOLAN HEIGHT / BETHSAIDA

This morning we take a relaxing boat ride on the Sea of Galilee where we will be able to look to the shore where so many miracles occurred. We will hto view the New Testament boat found below the sea and to visit the kibbutz. Then on to Chorazin, through the Hula Valley to Hazor, ruins of the powerful Canaanite city destroyed by Joshua and rebuilt by King Jabin and then by Solomon as a chariot city to command upper Galilee.

We continue to the northern limits of Jesus' travel as we cross the River Hatzbani to Dan, where we combine a nature walk beside the Upper Jordan with views of the ancient ruins, topped by the Israelite high place that supported a golden calf (I Kings 12). Then a short drive to Banias (Caesarea Philippi), dedicated to Pan the Greek god of pastures, flocks and shepherds; here Peter made his great profession of faith, recognition of Christ Jesus(Matthew 16). Driving along the foot of Mount Hermon, we ascend onto the Golan Plateau for a magnificent view of upper Israel. We will stop by the Jordan River for a chance to be Baptized or renew our commitment. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 5 - Saturday, November 19, 2011

TIBERIAS / SEA OF GALILEE / BET SHEAN / DEAD SEA

We continue to Capernaum and see first century ruins, then visit Tabgha and the Mount of Beatitudes. We then proceed to Mt. Arbel where we will hike to the top.

This afternoon we travel via the Crusader fortress of Belvoir along the Rift Valley to Bet Shean, where King Saul and his sons were pinned to the walls. It became the Decapolis Capital and was traveled by Jesus and known as Scythopolis. See the ancient theater, Circus Maximus and Cardo Maximo. We head down the Jordan River road and enter the Judean wilderness, on our way to the Dead Sea. We proceed to Qumran and the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. We will go to our hotel on the Dead Sea for dinner and overnight.

DAY 6 - Sunday, November 20, 2011

DEAD SEA / MASADA / JERICHO / JERUSALEM

This morning we will have some time for a swim in the Dead Sea or a mud bath that is cleanses many skin disorders. We then drive to Masada and ascend by cable car to the magnificent ruins of the fortress where, from70 to 73 AD, Jewish defenders made their last stand in the Judean revolt against Rome. We see the remains of storehouses, cisterns and a sixth-century Byzantine church. Continuing alongside the Dead Sea, 1300 ft. below sea level -- the lowest spot on earth -- we stop at Ein Gedi. Here we will have time for lunch or to walk to the water falls that David would have used while he was fleeing from Saul.

We travel to Jericho, the world's oldest city and see St. George's Monastery. Then we head up to Jerusalem where we will enter the Golden City for a panoramic view. Continue to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 7 - Monday, November 21, 2011

MT. OF OLIVES / SOUTHERN WALL / BETHLEHEM

"If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace" (Luke 19:42) We start the day with an orientation to Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives. We then walk the traditional Palm Sunday route to the church known as Dominus Flevit ("Our Lord weeps"). After viewing the Golden Gate, we walk downhill to Gethsemane, where we take time to meditate on the Gospel text. Boarding our bus we drive to the Dung Gate. Just inside we walk to the Southern Wall excavations. We then examine the ruins near the south side of the Temple complex, including steps where we may be certain that Jesus and the disciples walked, then to the slopes of Mt. Zion there we will visit the Upper Room and King David's Tomb. Our group will then descend the slope of the first Jerusalem ("City of David") to the Gihon Spring and wade in the knee-high water through Hezekiah's Tunnel. You will touch the walls chiseled 2700 years ago as we slosh through the water tunnel.

This afternoon we will head to Yad Vashem and see the Museum of the Holocaust. Continue to Shrine of the book and the model city of Jerusalem at the time of the Second Temple. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 8 - Tuesday, November 22, 2011 OLD CITY / VIA DOLOROSA

"He has risen!" (Mark 16:6) After breakfast we transfer to the Dung Gate, we walk up to the Western Wall Judaism's holiest site. We ascend to the Dome of the Rock and the Al-Aqsa

Mosque, the third holiest site of Islam, located on the traditional site of the ancient Temple Mount. It is believed that here is where the Temple once stood.Just to the north we find the Pools of Bethesda (John 5) and St. Anne's Church, the church is perfectly preserved from the Crusader period – with remarkable acoustics. We then follow the Way of the Cross (Via Dolorosa) through the bazaars as far as the Holy Sepulcher. From there we walk through the Christian Quarter along the Arab Souks and past the Armenian Quarter.

This afternoon we will enjoy an archeological dig at Bet Guvrin. On our way back to Jerusalem we will stop at the Valley of Elah where David fought Goliath. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 9 - Wednesday, November 23, 2011

EIN KAREM / BETHELEHEM

This morning we drive through the New City, passing the Knesset (Israel's Parliament building), and on into the hill country to a "city of Juda" which today is called Ein Karem. Here we shall visit the Church of the Visitation, which by tradition is built over the house of Zacharias, where the Virgin Mary came to visit her cousin Elisabeth (Lk. 1:39-80). Here John the Baptist, the forerunner of Christ, was born return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

This afternoon driving south, we visit Solomon's Pools, Jerusalem's main source of water for almost 2000 years. Passing the monastery of Hortus Conclusus ("the sealed garden") in Artas, we go to Herodium the palace set in a conical mountain that was built by Herod to mark his tomb. We then drive to one of the possible sites for the Shepherds' Fields and sing –Silent Night. We continue into Bethlehem itself, walking through the restored old town to the Church of the Nativity and visiting the manger as well as the cave of St. Jerome. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 10 - Thursday, November 24, 2011

OLD CITY /GARDEN TOMB / FREE DAY

"He has risen!" (Mark 16:6) This morning we enter Mt Zion to the grounds of a church called Peter in Gallicantu, which affords the best view of early Jerusalem from the west. (Here, the Assumptions Fathers suggest, was the house where the High Priest Caiaphas interrogated Jesus.). From there we board our bus and transfer to the Garden Tomb where we will have a special visit and the possibility of having a private communion on the grounds outside the city walls.

The rest of the afternoon is free to explore the city, finish any shopping or reflect on our spiritual journey. Dinner and over night at our hotel.

DAY 11 - Friday, November 25, 2011

JERUSALEM / TEL AVIV / PORTLAND

We transfer to the airport for our flight home with unforgettable memories to cherish always. Knowing we have walked in the footsteps of Jesus and the early Christians on such a memorable tour will bring new meaning to our Bible reading.

The Description of Coverage will be provided to you with your travel documents; it contains complete details on the coverage provided.

Included: Pre-existing Conditions Exclusion Waiver

When this protection plan is purchased to cover the full tour cost within 14 days of your initial deposit, and you are medically able to travel at the time of purchase (and have not filed a claim for trip cancellation due to a pre-existing illness within 120 days of the effective date of this insurance), the Pre-existing Conditions Exclusion will be waived. The Pre-existing Conditions Exclusion Waiver is not available to Canadian residents.

The following is a brief description of the coverage available.

- **Trip Cancellation/Interruption***: Coverage provides financial protection for expenses related to trip cancellation or interruption caused by a covered reason. Trip cancellation provides reimbursement for prepaid, non-refundable expenses, up to the amount of coverage purchased. Trip interruption coverage offers reimbursement for the unused, non-refundable portion of the trip and increased transportation costs to return home due to a covered reason. Some covered reasons include:
 - **A terrorist act** committed by an organized terrorist group (recognized as such by the U.S. State Department) if it results in property damage, injury or loss of life in a domestic or foreign city within 30 days of scheduled arrival in that city.
 - **Sickness, injury or death** of traveler, a covered family member or traveling companions results in the complete cessation of services. Supplier default is only provided if the traveler purchases insurance within 14 days of initial trip payment or deposit, financial default occurs more than 14 days after the policy's effective date and the travel supplier is listed on our list of covered suppliers.
 - **Strikes, natural disasters, or inclement wather**

- **Travel Delay***: Offers reimbursement to cover additional accommodation and travel expenses due to a delay of at least 12 hours. Covered reasons for travel delay include carrier caused delays (including bad weather) and unannounced strikes. Payments may not exceed \$150 per person per day.

- **Missed Connection***: Provides reimbursement of up to \$500 to cover certain expenses caused by a covered delay that forces the traveler to miss the scheduled flight or cruise.
